

FROM THE TRANSITIONAL PASTOR:

Since God chose you to be the holy people he loves, you must clothe yourselves with tenderhearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds us all together in perfect harmony. And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts. For as members of one body you are called to live in peace. And always be thankful. -Colossians 3:12-15

What a marvelous thing to hear: God CHOSE YOU to be holy people he loves! I don't know about you, but I need to be reminded of that from time to time. Chosen! Set aside for God (which is what holy people means). Loved! No matter what is happening in life, we are so blessed as we think about these words from Paul!

I think the words that follow are a bit more difficult to completely live out consistently. No one can *always* be tenderhearted, merciful, kind, humble, gentle, and patient. And making room for people's faults? Forgiving *anyone* who offends you? Let's just admit that we cannot perfectly live that out in our lives.

However, we CAN choose to strive to live these attributes of a Christ follower. Every day we can remind ourselves that God chose us for a purpose. There is something special that God has chosen each of us to do for Him – and only YOU can do that special something God has chosen for you to do for Him! We CHOOSE to be tenderhearted, merciful, kind, humble, gentle, patient, forgiving, and loving. It doesn't just happen. We must choose to practice being a Christ follower each day AND ask God to help us with the change we want to make in our lives.

Consider this true story: A woman, who considered herself to be a Christian her entire life and loved God, attended Sunday school every week as a child, and was a good person, was really struggling with the question, *Am I really good enough?* She stopped going to church as an adult believing that if she committed her life to God that would be the end of her fun.

Years went by and she hoped that she was good enough for God. One day, she decided that she "had time for church" and started attending worship. "I'd slide in and slide right back out, but I was really impressed with the pastor's sermons."

Then, on March 11, 2007, she was singing the song, "I Surrender All," and suddenly, she found herself *singing* the words, praying the words. Everything she had heard about following Jesus connected and fell into place.

She surrendered all and asked Jesus to come into her life and be her Lord and Savior. She CHOSE to give her life to Jesus and her life changed! Not everything is rosy. She still has problems, but she knows things are going to work out. She has a peace and trust that she never had before. It doesn't matter how old or young you are. It doesn't matter if you are rich, poor, or somewhere in between. You don't have to have everything in your life together. What matters is the choice you make: will you strive to become the person God wants you to be? That is a daily choice and begins one small step at a time: choose to acknowledge that God has selected you to be holy, tenderhearted, merciful, humble, gentle, patient, and loving. Choose ONE of those and ask God to help you work on becoming more like Jesus!


