FROM THE TRANSITIONAL PASTOR:

On February 17th we start the season of Lent, a time to reflect on our relationship with God as we remember the last days of Jesus' life. With all the "troubles" we have been dealing with the past year, I challenge all of us to think about Billy Graham's statement above and focus on *heaven's hope* during this Lenten season, rather than giving up something or berating ourselves for not being better at including God in our lives or something else. For indeed, "**Earth's troubles fade in the light of heaven's hope.**"

As I reflet back on the past year, what comes firmly to the front of my mind is that God keeps His promises! God promised to always be with us... and God was. God promised to provide for all our needs – even when people hoarded basic staples... and God was. God promised to grant us peace as we focus on Him... and God did if we did. God promised to love us.. and He does.

What has God done in your life? How have you grown closer to God? Have you spent the past year afraid or have you leaned on God to give you strength and courage? Where have you grown spiritually? When have you forgotten to feed you spirit through worship or prayer or Bible reading?

Everyone will have different answers to these questions. Some have rebelled against the restrictions meant to keep us from spreading the virus so quickly that hospitals would become overwhelmed. Some have rejoiced that the pace of life has slowed down. Some lost their jobs and the stress of paying bills and buying food and medication has been great. Some retained their jobs but had to adjust to doing things with COVID-19 NY state safety plans in mind.

Many things have changed very quickly and we are adjusting to those changes. One thing has never changed: GOD IS GOD. GOD ALWAYS HAS BEEN, GOD IS NOW, AND GOD WILL BE IN THE FUTURE. There will never be a time when God does not care about us. There will never be a time when God for-sakes us. There will never be a time when God forgets His promises to us.

The way we worship has changed. The way we hold meetings has changed. The way do ministry for God has changed. The way we interact with each other has changed. BUT GOD NEVER CHANGES. You can depend on that.

So during Lent this year, let us focus on God rather than the changes. Let us watch for God's hand at work in our lives and in the lives of others. Let us take time each morning and evening to spend 5 minutes talking to God and listening for His response. Let us focus not on ourselves but on others who are dealing with more than we are. Let us remain positive while others are fearful.

Please read this newsletter for we are doing **NEW THINGS** to help us feel more **NORMAL** during Lent.... like using Zoom more so we can be together during worship experiences. I am here for every one of you. If you need some time with me in person or over Zoom, let me know. I am meeting with people for pastoral care and spiritual mentoring by appointment only and am generally in the office on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. I pray for you every day and for the new pastor that you will be calling. God bless you and keep your faith in God strong!

President's Day Monday, February 15, 2021 <u>Office will be CLOSED</u>

Presidents' Day is an American holiday celebrated on the third Monday in February. Originally established in 1885 in recognition of President George Washington, it is still officially called "Washington's Birthday" by the federal government. Traditionally celebrated on February 22-Washington's *actual* day of birth—the holiday became popularly known as Presidents' Day after it was moved as part of 1971's Uniform Monday Holiday Act, an attempt to create more three -day weekends for the nation's workers. While several states still have individual holidays honoring the birthdays of Washington, Abraham Lincoln and other figures, Presidents' Day is now popularly viewed as a day to celebrate all U.S. presidents past and present.

GRIEFSHARE IS COMING!

The GriefShare Program is a biblical, Christ-centered seminar that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. There are three parts to each of the thirteen sessions: a DVD presentation that features nationally respected grief experts and real-life people telling their story; a small group discussion about the topic presented on the video; and a notebook that participants can work through on their own.

If you or someone you know is grieving the death of a loved one, we warmly invite you or them to join this seminar. Why join GriefShare? Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends and family members have returned to their daily routines. They don't understand the deep and prolonged impact caused by the death of a spouse, partner, child, family member or close friend. Those who are grieving need ongoing support. GriefShare is that ongoing support! Whether your bereavement experience is recent or not so recent, this group is for people who are looking for encouragement and understanding, as well as valuable information to use in the journey toward the new normal.


